College of Medicine Graduation Rates — Most Recent 5 Cohorts with Available Data

The visualization below displays the graduation rate (%) for students from each of the last five Matriculating Cohorts (Fall 2018 through Fall 2022) who graduated within 4 years (on-time, 100%), 5 years (125%), and 6 years (150%). Bars are labeled with both the graduation rate percentage and exact graduate count (n). "N/A" indicates data not yet available at time of publication.

FIGURE 1: College of Medicine — Graduation Rates for Most Recent 5 Matriculating Cohorts

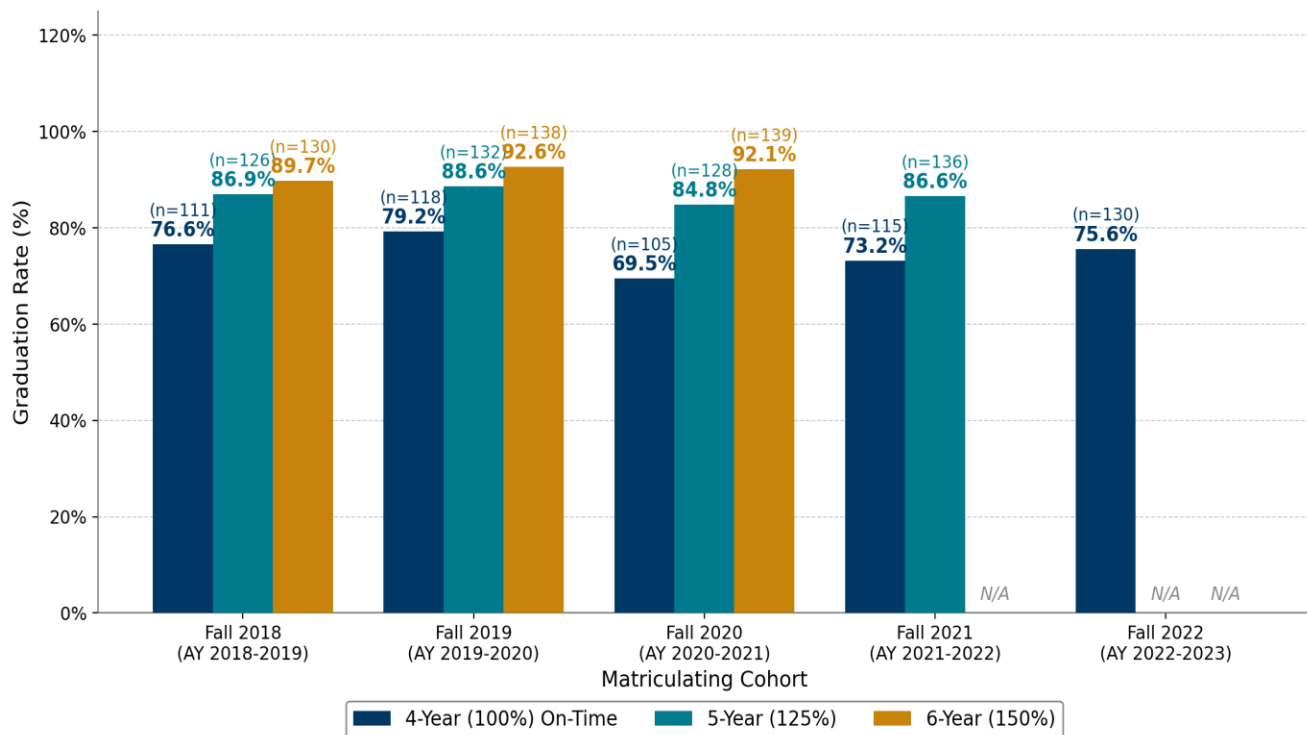


Figure 1: College of Medicine – Graduation Rates by Matriculating Cohort, Fall 2018 (AY 2018-2019) through Fall 2022 (AY 2022-2023). Navy bars represent 4-Year (100%) on-time graduation rates; teal bars represent 5-Year (125%) graduation rates; amber bars represent 6-Year (150%) graduation rates. Each bar is labeled with the graduation rate percentage and the corresponding graduate count (n=). "N/A" denotes data not yet available. The complete data set is provided in Table 1.

Chart Data Definitions

4-Year (100%) On-Time: Students awarded their degree on or before June 30th of their expected graduation year.

5-Year (125%): Students awarded their degree within 5 years of matriculation (cumulative total, including 4-year graduates).

6-Year (150%): Students awarded their degree within 6 years of matriculation (cumulative total, including 4- and 5-year graduates).

N/A: Data not yet available at time of publication.

Table 1: College of Medicine — Graduation Rates and Counts by Matriculating Cohort, Fall 2018–Fall 2022. The header row identifies each graduation rate time point. Data rows display total matriculants and graduate counts/percentages for 4-Year (100%), 5-Year (125%), and 6-Year (150%) time points. All graduation rate percentages are cumulative. "N/A" denotes data not yet available at time of publication. "—" indicates percentage cannot be calculated when count is unavailable. Alternating row shading is decorative only and does not convey data meaning.

Important Definitions

- 1) **Matriculating Cohort** includes all First-Time and any Previously Admitted Students officially starting their M.D. program as of Fall 15-Day (Census) Date.
- 2) **Graduation Rates** are based off the number of students belonging to a Matriculating Cohort who complete their program within a specified increment of time equal to a percentage (i.e., 100%, 125%, 150%) of their program's expected length for full-time students (i.e., ≤ 4 years for the M.D. program = 100% On-Time Graduation).
 - a. **June 30th** of each year serves as the official cutoff date for calculating graduation rates, determined from the date on which a degree is officially awarded according to NEOMED's Student Information System (i.e., Banner).
 - b. **Example:** If a student belonging to the Fall 2018 (AY 2018-2019) Matriculating Cohort was officially awarded their degree on May 27, 2022, they would be counted in that cohort's 100% (4-Year) On-Time Graduation Rate. However, if this student was officially awarded their degree on July 2, 2022, then they would **NOT** be included in that cohort's 100% (4-Year) On-Time Graduation Rate and would instead be counted in that cohort's 125% (5-Year) Graduation Rate.
- 3) **M.D. = Doctor of Medicine; AFMP = Accelerated Family Medicine Program; COM = College of Medicine.**
