- **MAT Training** – up to 12 hours (8 hours on-site training, 4 hours follow-up training).
- A **\$30** conference fee will be charged at the time of registration and includes coffee service.

- Open to **primary care** medical educators, and practicing primary care physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners and resident physicians. Primary care providers are frequently the first line care for many patients with opioid use disorders.

To address this critical training need, NEOMED is offering Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) training designed specifically for primary care providers.

The MAT training is no longer required to prescribe buprenorphine but the training **WILL FULFILL THE DEA REQUIREMENT FOR YOUR LICENSURE.**
