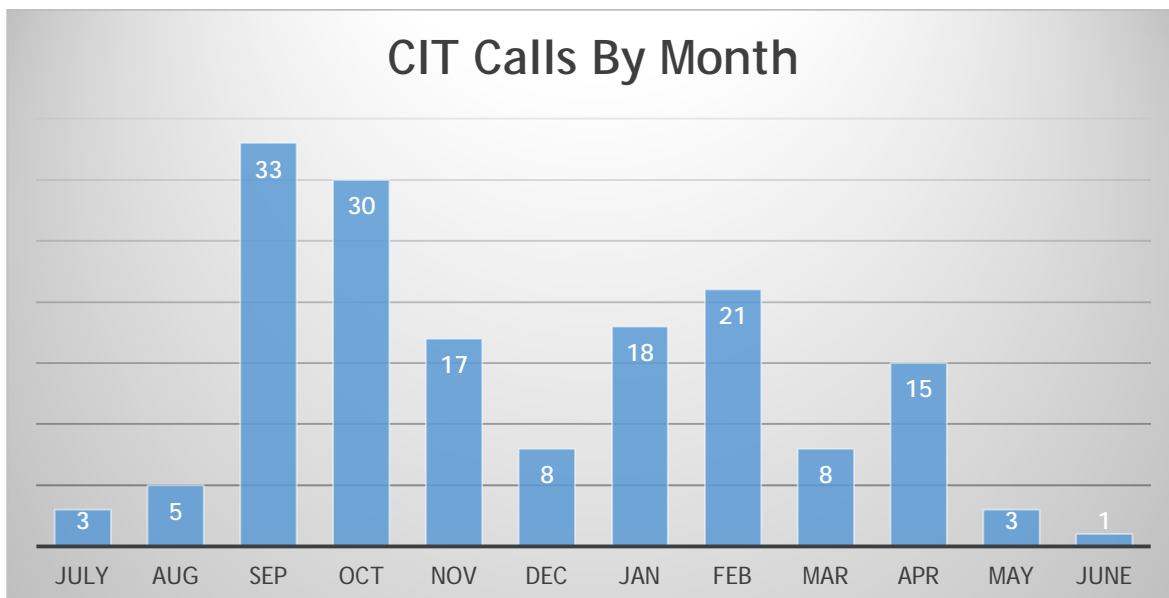

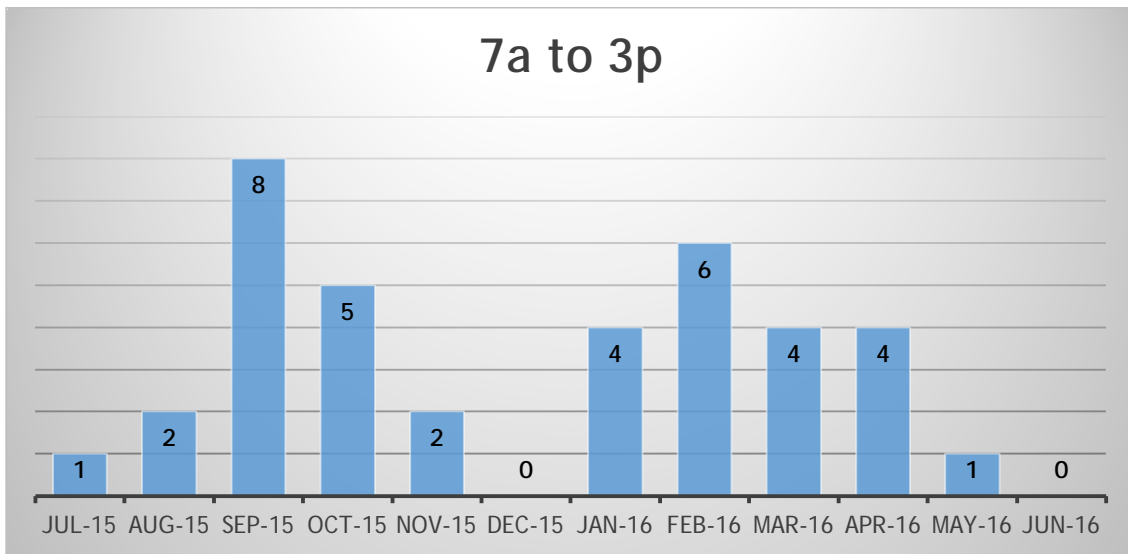

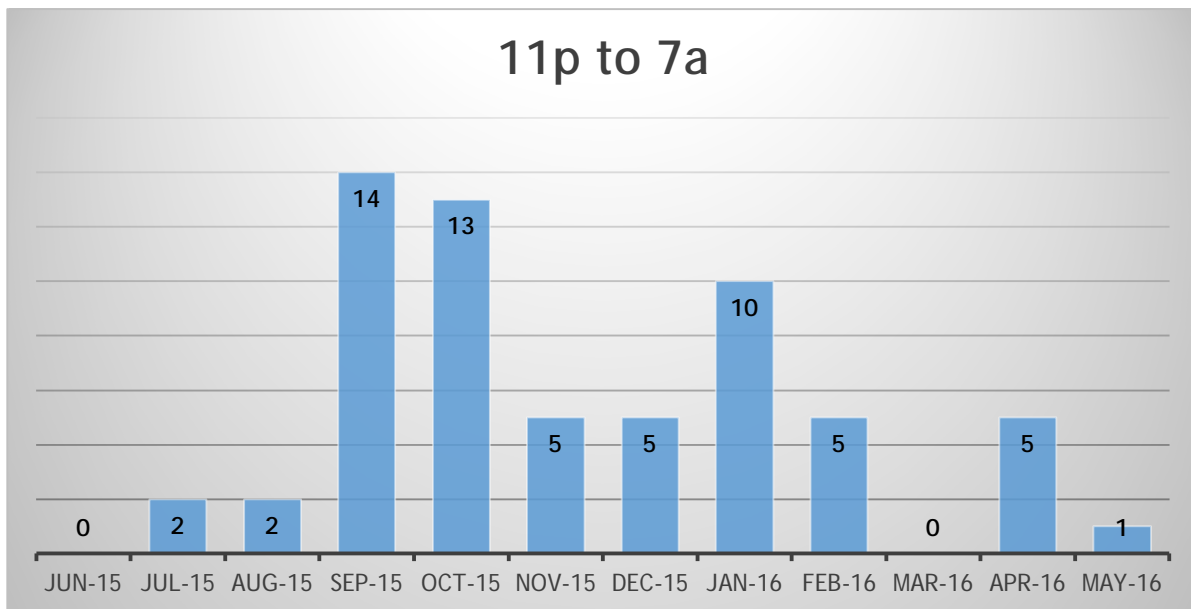
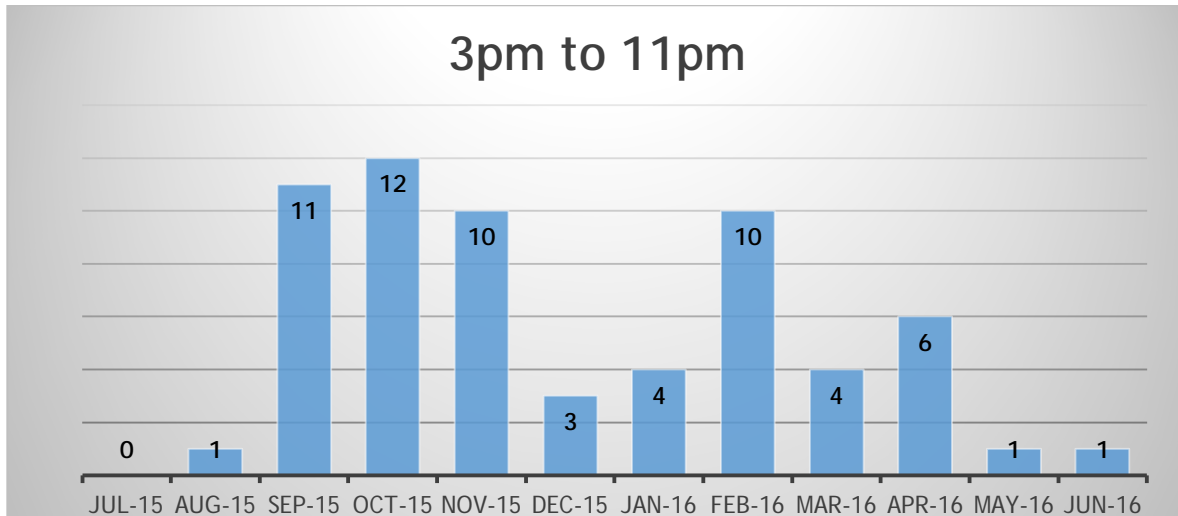


### Calls by Shift:

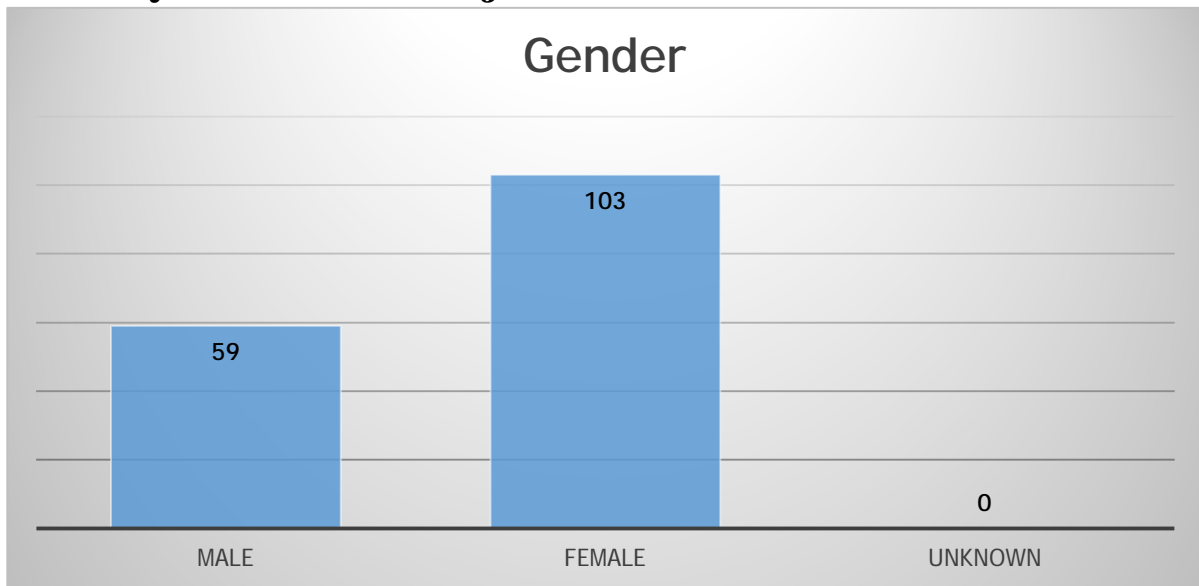


### Calls by Month Per Shift:

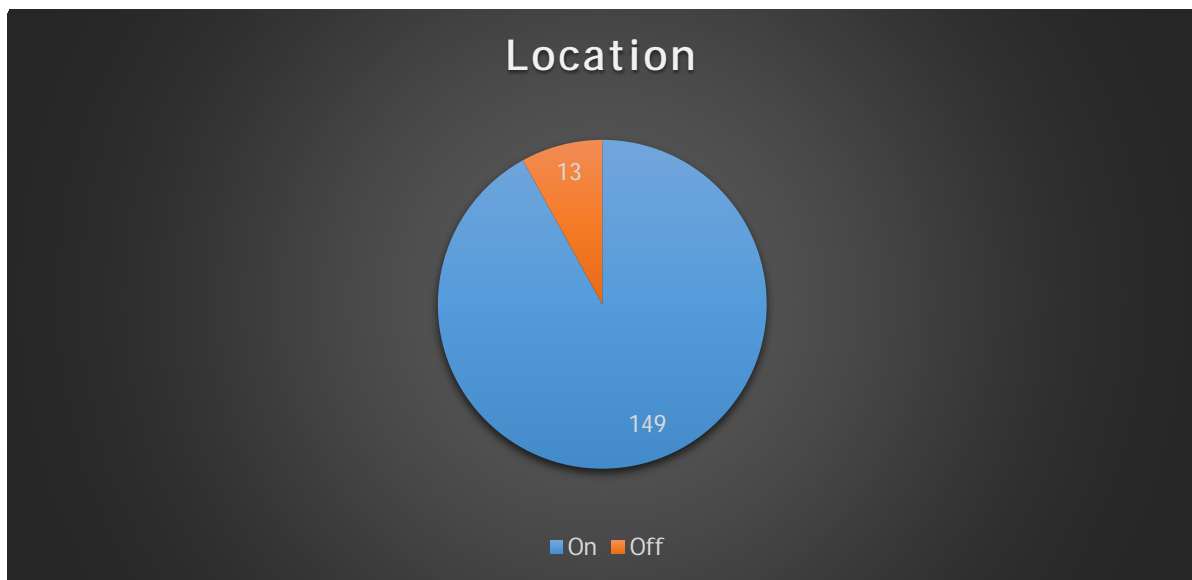




## Calls by Gender of Subject:



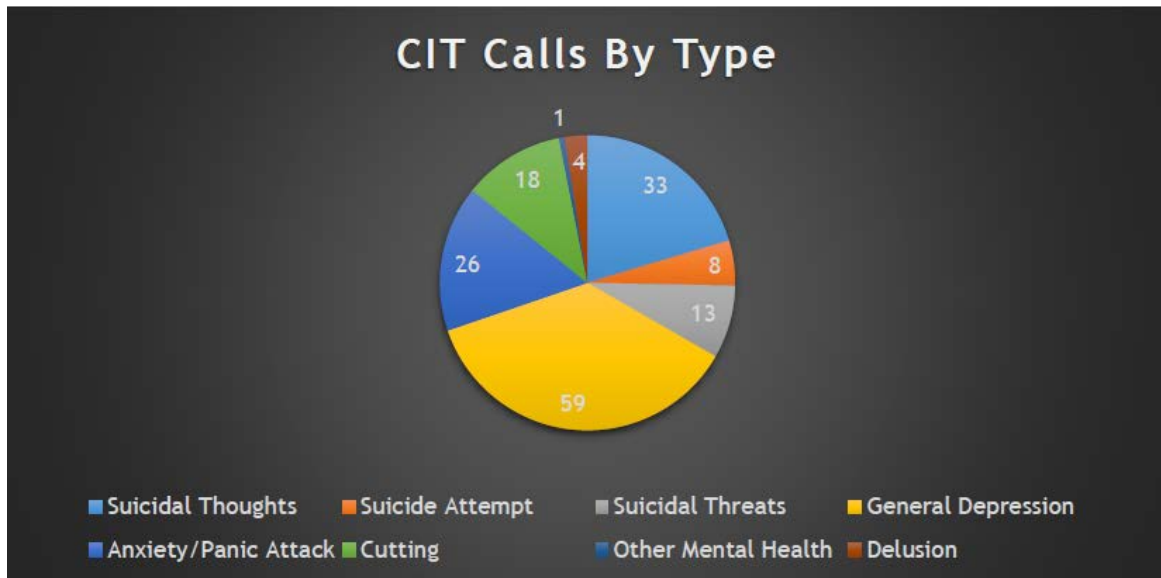

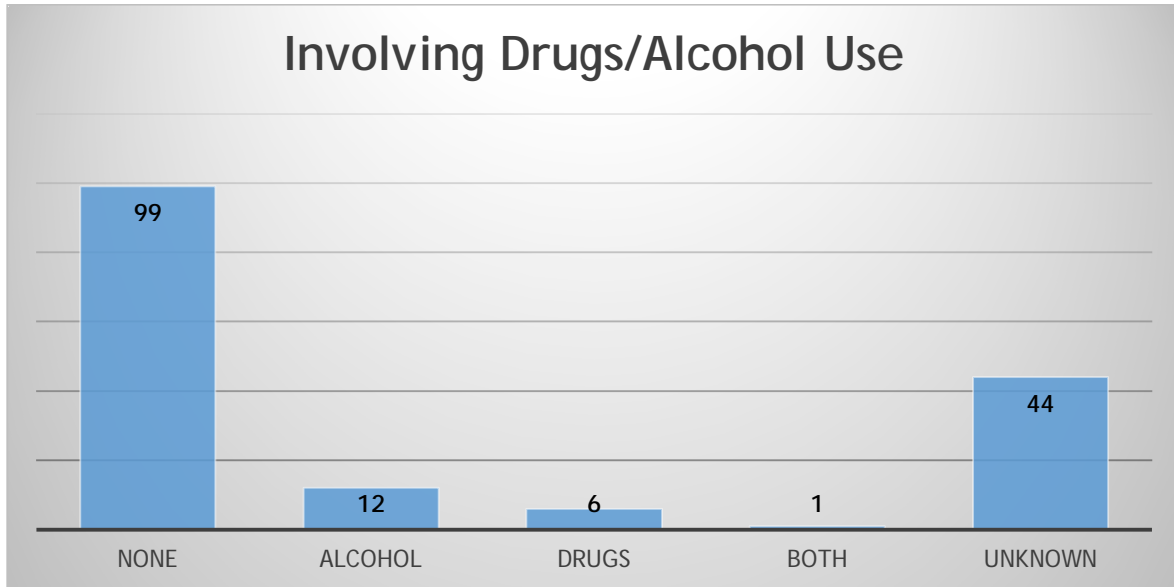

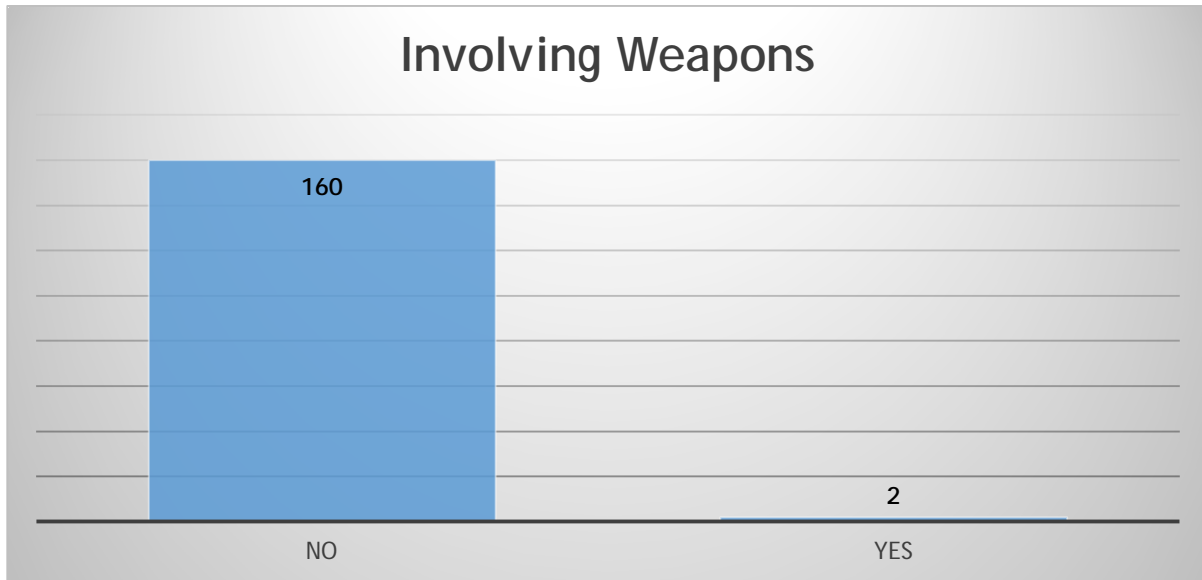

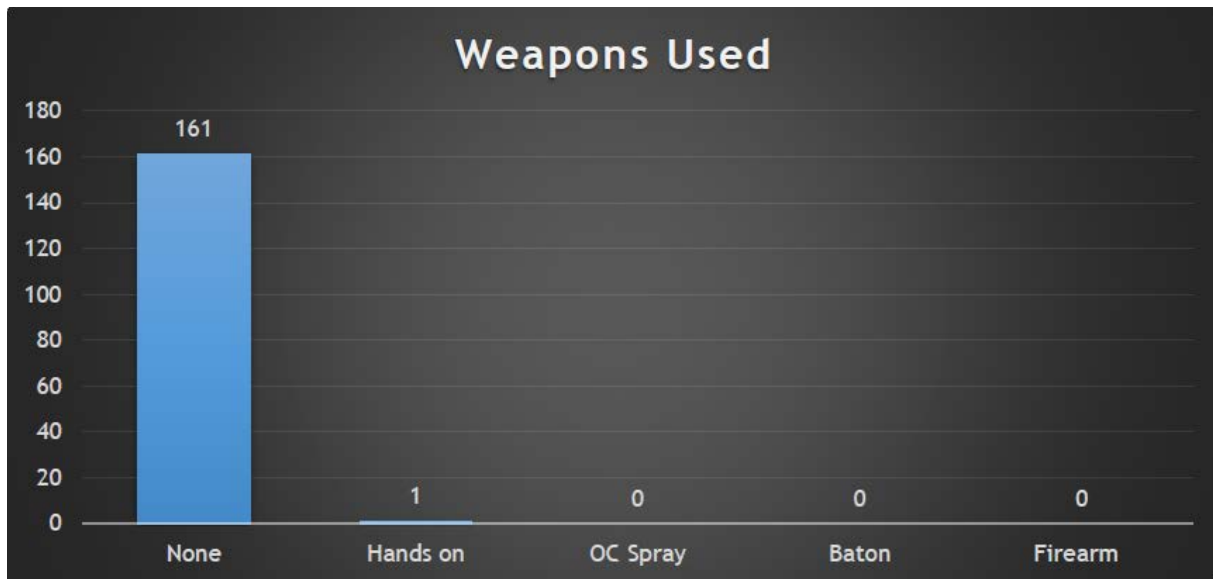


### Calls Involving Subjects with Weapons:

### Calls Involving Use of Force or Weapons Drawn by Officers:

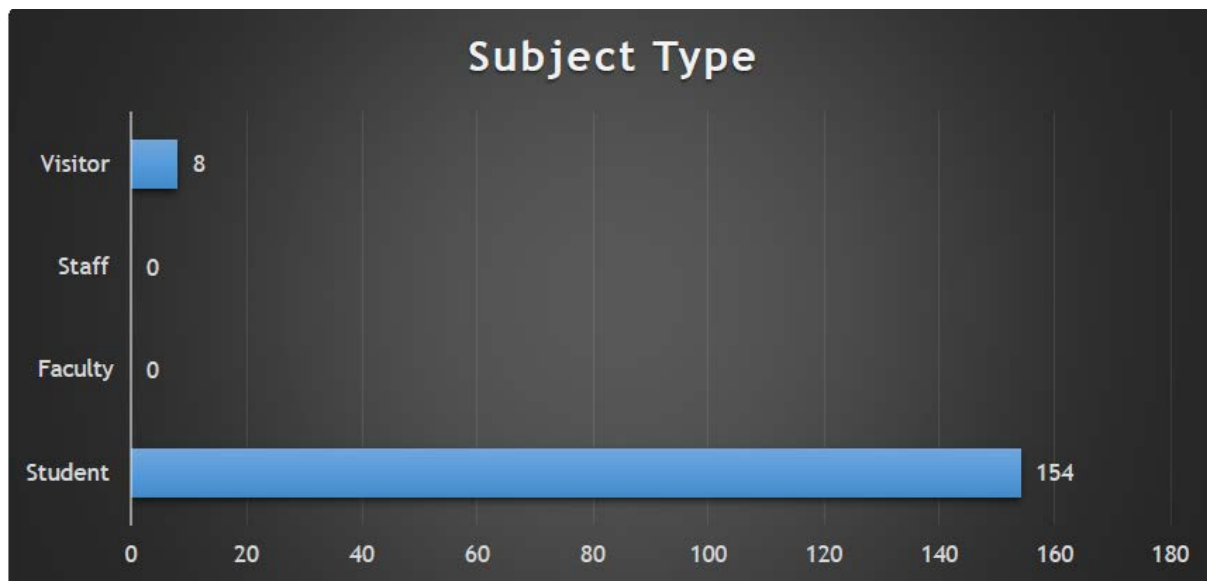




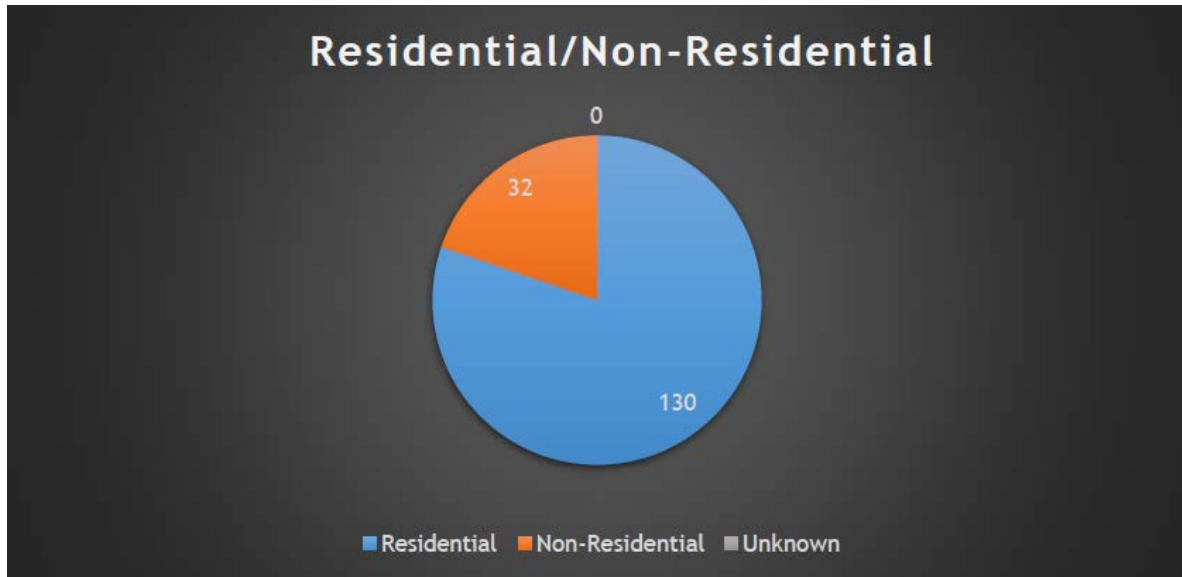
### Calls Involving Homeless Subjects:



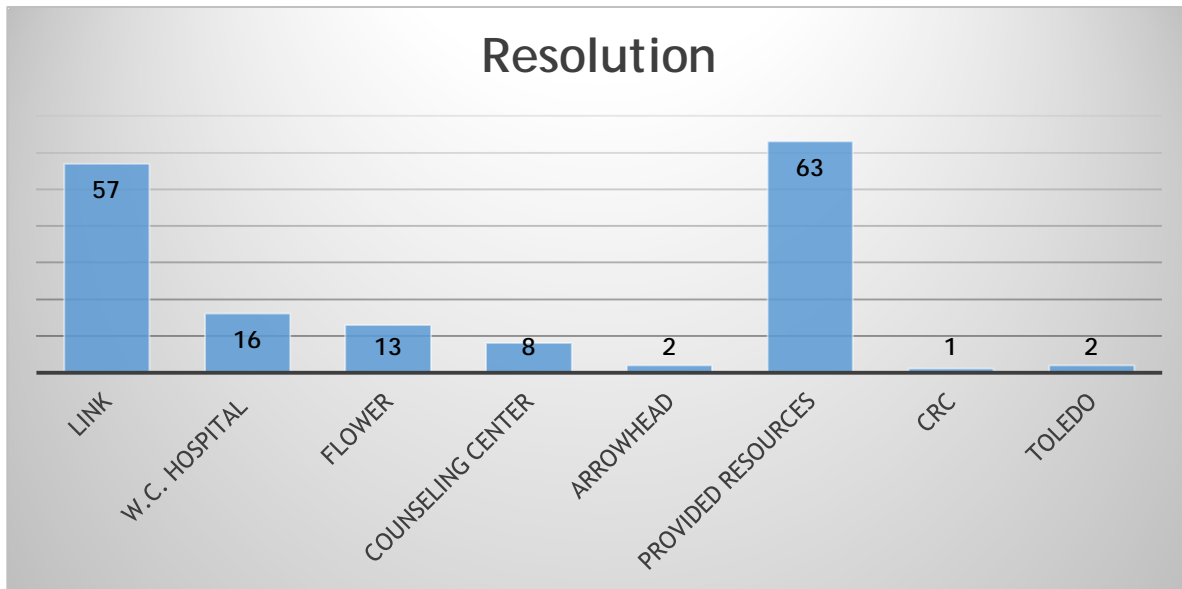

**CIT Calls Involving Arrests:**

8370-15: Subject was arrested for disorderly conduct while intoxicated due to unable to take care of himself. \*Subject was a student.

5308-16-15: Subject was arrested for criminal damaging and disorderly conduct. \*Subject was a student.

**CIT Summary:**

In summary, the increase in CIT calls from 131 last fiscal year to 162 this fiscal year may have been due in part to an increase in enrollment of 895 more students this past academic year. Additionally, two more officers received CIT training in the past fiscal year. We currently have 16 officers CIT trained and all of our dispatchers are CIT trained. Our CIT trained officers and dispatchers do a great job of recognizing persons in crisis, and are aware of the resources available to them as an alternative to taking disruptive people to jail. Our Department has also increased the number of education programs provided to the community, such as A.L.I.C.E, behaviors of concern, general safety talks, safety talks to international students, and other topics. As in previous years, our outreach to the community may have made it more likely that community members felt comfortable calling the police as a resource for CIT incidents, and better trained staff may have been more likely to recognize incidents, causing them to more often be labeled and handled appropriately as CIT calls.
