INITIAL HEARING QUESTIONS

Describe 1st Contact w/ Respondent-date of exam & length of exam, date of hospitalization, circumstances of hospitalization

Physical Appearance-hygiene, eating, sleeping

Describe Respondent's Mental State-working diagnosis, prior hospitalizations, prior treatment, opinion w/in a reasonable degree of _____ certainty

Substantial Disorder of thought, mood, perception, orientation or memory (examples)

Which grossly impair judgment, behavior, capacity to recognize reality, ability to meet ordinary demand of life (examples)

Is Respondent a Mentally Ill person subject to hospitalization

Substantial risk of physical harm to self-threaten/attempt at suicide or self-Harm

Substantial risk of physical harm to others-homicidal/violent behavior or recent Threats placing another in reasonable fear of violent behavior/serious physical Harm

Substantial and immediate risk of physical impairment or injury to self/unable to Provide for and is not providing for basic physical needs because of mental illness And appropriate provisions for such needs not immediately available in the Community

Would benefit from treatment in a hospital and is in need of treatment/behavior Creates a grave and imminent risk to substantial rights of others/self

Would benefit from treatment as manifested by evidence of behavior that indicates all of the following:

The person is unlikely to survive safely in the community without supervision, based on a clinical determination.

The person has a history of lack of compliance with treatment for mental illness and one of the following applies:

At least twice within the 36 month period prior to the filing of the affidavit seeking court ordered treatment of the person under section 5122.111 the lack of compliance has been a significant factor in necessitating hospitalization in a hospital or receipt of services in a forensic or other mental health unit of a correctional facility provided that the 36 month period shall be extended by the length of any hospitalization or incarceration of the person that occurred within the 36 month period

Within the 48 months prior to the filing of an affidavit seeking court ordered treatment of the person under section 5122.111, the lack of compliance resulted in one or more acts of serious violent behavior toward self or others or threats of or attempts at serious physical harm to self or others provided that the 48 month period shall be extended by the length or any hospitalization or incarceration of the person that occurred within the 48 month period.

The person as a result of mental illness is unlikely to voluntarily participate in necessary treatment.

In view of the person's treatment history and current behavior, the person is in need of treatment in order to prevent a relapse or deterioration that would be likely to result in substantial risk of serious harm to the person or others.
