The purpose of these grants is to promote collaboration between college/university and community stakeholders to develop programming to prevent suicide, promote mental health and reduce stigma about mental illness or its treatment on campus.

Ursuline College received the Campus-Community Collaborative Grant to provide Mental Health First Aid and QPR Suicide Prevention training to students, faculty, and staff in collaboration with Notre Dame College and Recovery Resources and to prepare Ursuline staff to offer these trainings in the future.
