***Students who fail one NBME subject exam will have an initial clerkship grade of “**Academic-Incomplete**” (AI) appear on their official transcript. If the student successfully ~~remediates~~ **retakes** the subject exam on the first attempt, the initial grade of “**Academic-Incomplete**” will be replaced with a grade of “pass” on the student’s official transcript. Regardless of the student’s performance on a **retake or** remediation exam, the highest final clerkship grade that the student can receive is “pass”. If the student fails the retake exam, the “**Academic-Incomplete**” will be replaced with a “fail” that will remain on the official transcript. Likewise, any subsequent NBME subject exam failures that result in a clerkship grade of “fail” will remain on the official transcript.
