FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: DOES NEOMED OFFER FINANCIAL COUNSELING AND PLANNING FOR ENTERING STUDENTS?

A: The Office of Financial Aid provides Education Debt Management counseling to any interested student upon their enrollment at NEOMED. Students can meet with a member of the Office to examine financial aid opportunities and determine which programs may work best for them. Students will also receive help navigating options to repay their student loans. Students may contact a member of the Financial Aid Office to schedule an appointment by emailing finaid@neomed.edu. Q: THERE IS A CHARGE LISTED AS “GENERAL FEE.” WHAT DOES THAT CONSIST OF?

A: All students are assessed a general fee each semester. This fee is a single, comprehensive fee that helps fund a number of University services offered to students, including computer equipment and technologies to provide support for the students academic experiences; access to all student activities and events; expansion and maintenance of academic facilities to enhance and improve student experiences; and printing and parking services.

Q: WHY DOES TUITION FOR THE PHARMACY PROGRAM COST LESS THAN THE TUITION FOR THE MEDICINE PROGRAM?

A: Each degree program exists within a unique competitive landscape. The College of Pharmacy competes with other pharmacy schools in Ohio, and wants to make sure tuition is in the range of others to attract students.

Q: WHY ARE STUDENTS CHARGED FEES SUCH AS A “STUDENT HEALTH AND FITNESS” EVEN WHEN THEY ARE NOT ON CAMPUS?

A: Tuition and fees reflect the combined University and College expenses of a four-year education at NEOMED. They do not necessarily reflect the expenses for that specific academic year period — the total cost is divided/apportioned over the four-year academic program, as do most medical schools. In response to student input and feedback, NEOMED has reduced by 50% the wellness center fees for third-year College of Medicine students and completely eliminated these fees for fourth-year medicine and pharmacy students.

Q: WHY DO MEDICINE STUDENTS PAY MORE TUITION IN YEAR THREE THAN IN OTHER YEARS?

A: The tuition variance in year three reflects the additional summer semester of training time that occurs during year three.




